



What Grimsby wants post-Brexit?

- 'Protected Industry Cluster' status
- Affordable seafood products = increase consumption = 2 per week
- Continuation of rules for the checks on product of animal origin from EU, Iceland and Norway (BIP)
- Status Quo or preferential import duties and taxes Free Port
- Passport to work scheme
- Abolish Border Inspection Post Fees
- Reduction in tax burdens for business running costs
- Innovation vouchers and grant funding schemes for growth
- Create economically viable and competitive inward investment platform



Brexit outlook for Grimsby & Iceland

- We need to get our heads together to ensure routines we have today are not negatively impacted by Brexit
- Secure and increase supply = 60,000+ tonnes
- Maintain direct shipping links
- Smooth transfer of fish to France
- Grimsby has a huge appetite for fish & seafood
- Auction market support
- Joint awareness raising profile of Icelandic sourced seafood being processed and packed in Grimsby
